Fact Sheet: Leaf Pick-Up Program

The City of Cleveland's Department of Public Works will resume the Leaf Pick-Up Program in designated neighborhoods beginning Nov. 6th, 2017. The program will continue through Dec. 31st, 2017. The department's budget has increased by \$4.6 million allowing for improved park and playground infrastructure maintenance, urban forestry and has a stronger focus on illegal dumping reduction and city clean-up.

Here are more important facts to know about the Leaf Pick-Up program:

- This program is a renewed city service. It was previously discontinued in 2011 due to budget constraints.
- Thanks to Issue 32 dollars – which have increased the number of city services improved under Mayor Frank G. Jackson's enhanced budget – the Leaf Pick-Up Program has been reinstated.
- Based on an assessment conducted by the Department of Urban Forestry and the Department of Public Works, neighborhoods deemed “high leaf generation areas” have been selected for the service.
- High leaf generation areas are determined to have the highest concentration of city-owned trees located on tree lawns and/or those areas potentially causing flooding or other hazardous conditions. The city's six service stations will systematically deploy sweepers, leaf machines, end loaders, and leaf blowers in these areas throughout the day.

How it works:

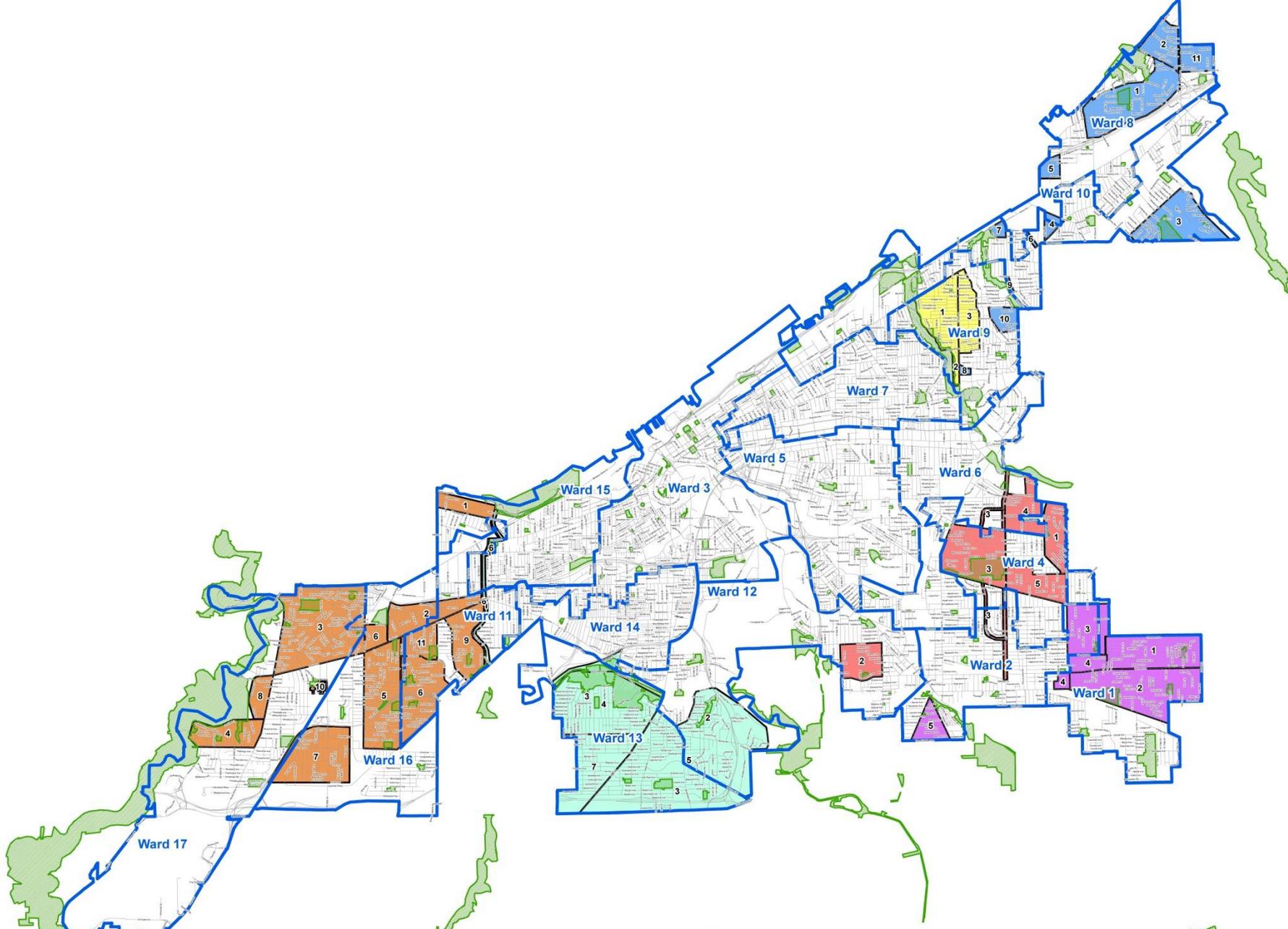
- Residents in the designated areas should expect leaf pick-up signs posted one week prior to service.
- To streamline the pick-up process, residents are encouraged to rake leaves from their property onto the tree lawn.
- To accommodate city crews, residents are asked to park off-street, if possible, during the service period. Each area will be serviced a minimum of two times within the eight-week period (weather permitting).
- Leaves will be transported to an approved leaf compost site, diverting more than 2,000 tons of leaf material from the waste stream.
